Cases

German nouns and pronouns have four cases: nominative, accusative, dative, and genitive. The case of a noun or pronoun indicates its grammatical function within a sentence.

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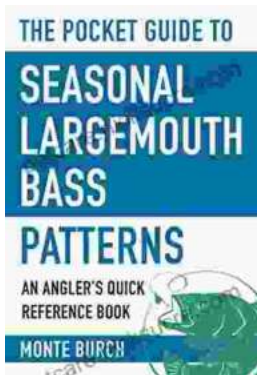
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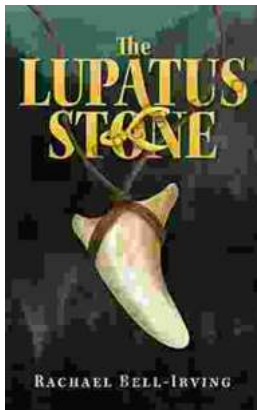
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
